 as follows. Beginning on a box elder tree 4 in diam
 on the west bank of the Brazos River, being League No 16
 from which a cotton wood tree 12 in diam bears N 57° W
 at 10 V. also an ash tree 6 in diam N 72° W. at 5 1/2 V
 thence down the river meandering the same for
 a base of 2500 V. viz. S 60° E 1600 V. S 50° E 1260 V.
 N 70° E 390 V. S 50° E 420 V. South 300 V. S 60° W 1090 V
 N 77° W 1520 V. ^{& past the mouth of Spring creek} S 55° W 300 V. S 33° W 90 V. to a cedar
 tree 14 in diam from which a cedar tree 8 in diam
 bears S 30° E at an varr. also a cedar tree 6 in diam
 bears west at 1 1/2 V. Thence S 60° W 720 3/4 V. at
 500 V enters prairie. & past to the corner & drives a
 stake no bearings. Thence N 30° W 2500. to a stake
 no bearings. Thence N 60° E 8 25 7 1/2 V. to the beginning
 at 4257 V strike Spring creek. at 5760 V strike the
 line & to the beginning. containing an area of 24,000,000
 square Varos. in superficies of which 2/3 is farming & 1/3 is
 farming land without the facility of irrigation surveyed the
 4th day of May 1835 - by C. P. Chance D. S.
