

# PROOF TO PROCURE LAND CERTIFICATE,

To persons who have been permanently disabled by reason of wounds received while in active service of the State or of the Confederate states, by virtue of an act of the 17th Legislature, approved April 9, 1881.

This blank is furnished by J. H. COLLETT, Austin, Texas. I have a different blank for soldier himself.

THE STATE OF TEXAS,

County of Bosque

BEFORE the Commissioners' Court of the county aforesaid personally appeared

Mrs. J. D. Young the widow of R. B. Young to us well known, who, being first duly sworn, says:

1. That she was a *bona fide* resident of this State at the date of the passage of this law, and is now a resident citizen of this State, and so was her husband a resident citizen of this State when he, R. B. Young, enlisted in the military service of the Confederate States in the late war between the States of the United States. 2. That her said husband <sup>(was killed)</sup> ~~was killed~~ <sup>in actual</sup> ~~in actual~~ service under such enlistment. 3. And that she is unmarried and has always been unmarried since the death of her husband. 4. And that she has not property of the value of one thousand dollars.

Also at the same time before us personally came E. B. George and A. J. Randal credible persons, and to us well known, who, being duly sworn, depose and say that they know J. D. Young the first affiant, and that she is the identical person she represents herself to be, and that the facts stated by her are true, and that she is entitled to a land certificate under the provisions of said act.
