dollars, Also at the same time before us personally

who, being duly sworn, depose, and say that they know  
John H Reed, the first affiant, and that he is the identical  
person he represents himself to be and that the facts  
stated by him are true, and that he is entitled to a land  
Certificate under the provisions of said Act.
