of her said husband, and that she is
in indigent circumstances, and has not
as much property and effects as would
amount to one thousand dollars in
value, and appeared also G. H. Martin,
and M. J. Raymer, two credible persons
who being sworn on oath stated
that the facts above set forth are
true, and that applicant Mrs M. E. Mar-
tin has not property of the value of
one thousand dollars. We therefore
certify that said applicant Mrs M. E.

Martin, is entitled to a certificate for
1280 acres of land under the act ap-
proved April 9th A.D. 1881 and we rec-
ommend to the Commissioners of the
General Land Office that the same
be issued.
