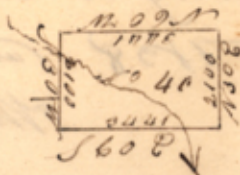

for James Manor situated on the ^{East} side of the Colorado River
on Gillilands Creek 35 miles above Bastrop it being the quantity
of Land to which said James Manor is entitled to by virtue
of Land Warrant no. 3164. issued at the City of Houston
on the third day of May 1838 for military services by Bernard C. an

of Lot no 41 for James Gilliland at a stake from which
an Elm tree was 8 rods distant (and a Plum bush bears South
2 rods distant Thence S 30° W 1100 rods made a stone mound in the

S 60° E 3500 rods to Gillilands creek 3441 rods to a stake in the prairie
