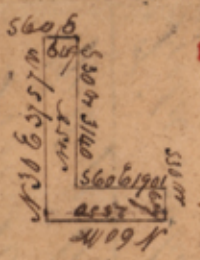

That *William P. Baxter* having served faithfully and honorably for the Term of *Six* Months, from the *fourth* day of *June* 1835 until the *fourth* day of *December* 1835 and having been honorably discharged is entitled to *Six hundred and forty* Acres Bounty Land, for which this is his CERTIFICATE.

And the said *William P. Baxter* is entitled to hold said Land; or to sell, alienate, convey and donate the same; and to exercise all rights of ownership over it.

In Testimony whereof, I have hereunto set my Hand, at *Austin* this *thirtyfirst*. day of *March* 1840
