he has occupied and improved the same as a homestead for the period of three consecutive years, beginning

on the 14<sup>th</sup> day of August 1890; that he is a single man and that he

makes this affidavit for the purpose of obtaining a title to the same for a homestead, under "An Act for the  
benefit of actual occupants of the public lands," approved May 26, 1873, and that he has not a homestead  
other than the above.
