THIS IS TO CERTIFY, that *Baxter Clark* has appeared before the Board of Land Commissioners for the County of Houston, and proved according to law that *he arrived in* this Republic

*March eighteenth* hundred and *thirty five* and that *he* is a *Head Man* and entitled to *one labor* of land, upon the condition of paying at the rate of *three dollars and fifty cents* for each labor of Irrigable land *two dollars and fifty cents* for each labor of temporal or arable land and *one dollar and twenty cents* for each labor of pasture land which may be contained in the survey secured to *him* by this certificate.

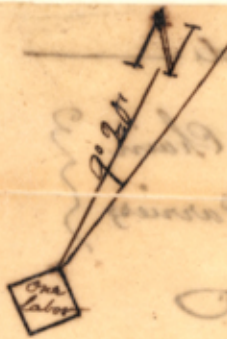
