varas another pine bear S 20th W 7 varas.

County of Houston, for the County aforesaid this day came and
personally appeared Darcus Calhoun a resident-citizen of said
County who being by me duly sworn, declares that he is a bona fide
settler upon 160 acres of Vacant Public Land situated in said
County and surveyed for Fred Calhoun (now dead) on the
27th day of Oct. 1871 by Charles Stokes Deputy
surveyor of said County; that she has occupied and improved
the same as a homestead for the period of three consecutive
years beginning on the 1st day of July 1871 that he is a ^{married} ~~married~~
^{woman} man and the head of a family, and that she makes this affi-
davit for the purpose of obtaining a title to the same for a home-
stead under an Act supplementary to "An Act to regulate the dis-
posal of the Public Lands of the State of Texas" approved March
24th 1871, and that he has not a homestead other than the above
and also at the same time came and personally appeared
J. H. McElvey and Jack Johnson
two credible resident-citizens of said County, to me well
known who being duly sworn depose and say that Dar-
cus Calhoun the person first above named in this
affidavit has actually settled upon and cultivated as a home-
stead the land surveyed for ^{Fred Calhoun his late husband now dead} him on the 27th day of October
