bona fide settler upon 160 acres of vacant public land,
situated in said County, and surveyed for J. S. Eaves
on the 20th day of May 1871 by Mark Muller County
surveyor of said County; that he has occupied and improved the same
as a Homestead for the period of three consecutive years, beginning on
the 1 day of January 1872 that he is a married man and the head
of a family, and that he makes this affidavit for the purpose of
obtaining a title to the same for a Homestead under an Act Supplementary
to "An Act to regulate the disposal of the public lands of the State
of Texas, approved March 24, 1871, and that he has not a Homestead
other than the above.

And also at the same time came and personally appeared
James Best and G. M. Dodson
two credible resident citizens of said County, to me well known
who being duly sworn, depose and say that J. S. Eaves
the person first above named in this affidavit, has actually settled
upon and cultivated as a Homestead the land surveyed for him
