 the widow of John Will deceased
 and a resident citizen of said County
 who being by me duly sworn declares
 that she is a bona fide settler upon
 one hundred and Sixty acres of vacant
 Public Land situated in said County
 and surveyed for the said Will
 on the day of 18 by
 Surveyor of said County
 and that she has occupied and improved
 the same as a Homestead for the period
 of three consecutive years beginning on
 the day of 1871 that she is
 married and the head of a
 family and that she makes this affi-
 davit for the purpose of obtaining a
 title to the same for a Homestead under
 an act supplementary to an act to
 regulate the disposal of the Public Lands
 of the State of Texas approved March 9th
 1871 and that she has not a Homestead
 other than the above
