At the request of Mr.P.L. Meath the president of the Pecos-Orla Sulphur Company I have made a check survey of the property of the Michigan Sulphur Company or as officially known the VIRGINIA PATENT.

This land has been in litigation considerable but as far as I can learn it was settled as to location along in 1915 or 1916 and resurveyed by R.J.Owens a · licensed Land Surveyor working for Morgan Mining interests, in May 1927.
