This is to certify that William C. Davila has appeared before us the Board of Land Commissioners for the County of Galveston, and proved according to Law that he emigrated to this County in the Year of Our Lord 1839; that he has been an actual citizen of this Republic for the Term of three Years, and has done and performed all the duties required of him as a citizen; That he is a single man, and has never obtained a certificate for land and is therefore entitled to an unconditional grant of three hundred and twenty acres of land in accordance with an act of Congress approved January the 10th 1840

Given under our hands at the City of Galveston this 17th day of November 1840

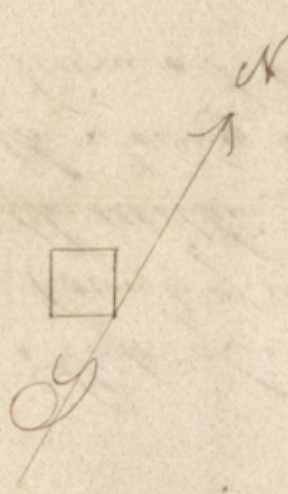

in consideration of Thirty Two Dollars to me in hand paid
have this day bargained sold alienated and conveyed
and do by these presents bargain sell alienate and
convey unto James H. Brown his heirs executors and
assigns all my right title interest and claim in and
to Three Hundred and Twenty Acres of land to be
entered and surveyed upon Tany of the public land
of the Republic of Texas by virtue of my Heavright
Certificate Number One hundred & fifty 150 of Issued to
me by the Board of Land Commissioners for the County of
Galvestone on the Seventeenth day of November A.D. 1845.
for Three Hundred & Twenty acres of land as will more fully
appear by reference to the original Certificate hereto
annexed which said Certificate is hereby surrendered
and declared a part and portion of this title to
have and to hold the said land unto the said J. H.
Brown his heirs and assigns forever, in full fee simple right
together with all the rights privileges tenements and
appurtenances unto the same belonging or in any
manner incident or appertaining thereto, free from
the claim or claims of any and all persons claiming
or to claim the same hereby divesting myself my heirs
executors and assigns of all right title interest and
claim in or to the aforesaid land and declaring
the same ^{vested} in the said Brown his heirs executors
and assigns forever
