And the said Joseph H. Bernard is entitled to hold said Land, or to sell, alienate, convey and donate the same, and to exercise all rights of ownership over it.

a citizen of said County for & in consideration of the sum
of Twenty four dollars to me in hand paid by John Hesse
and the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged
& confessed have granted, bargained, sold & conveyed, and by these
presents do Grant, Bargain, Sell & convey unto the said
Settle all my right, title, interest, claim and
demand in and to the same hundred & sixty acres of land
to which I am entitled by virtue of the foregoing certificate
No. 4472 - signed by Charles Mason Adj. Secretary of War at
Washington the 28th day of November 1838 - I have and
to hold unto him the said J. Settle
his heirs and assigns, the said land, from this time forth
forever - I hereby authorize him the said Settle to
do all lawful things to do in and to the said land to
obtain a patent from the Government
therefor, at his own proper charge & expense in as full
and complete a manner as I could do for myself
and in my own behalf
