That Thomas Morrow, having served faithfully and honorably for the term of Four Months from the twenty fifth day of July until the twenty fifth day of November 1836 and having been honorably discharged is entitled to Three hundred twenty Acres Bounty Land, for which this is his CERTIFICATE.

And the said Thomas Morrow is entitled to hold said Land, or to sell, alienate, convey and donate the same, and to exercise all rights of ownership over it.

peared Thomas Morrow who declared that for and  
in consideration of the sum of Sixty Dollars to him in  
hand paid by Gabriel Jackson the receipt  
whereof is hereby acknowledged, he has this day granted  
bargained sold aliened conveyed and confirmed and  
by these presents doth grant bargain sell alien convey  
and confirm unto the said Gabriel Jackson  
his heirs and assigns a Certificate for three  
hundred and twenty acres of Bounty Land  
granted to him by the Secretary of War on the  
thirteenth day of April one thousand eight  
hundred and thirty eight for services rendered  
the Government from the twenty fifth day of  
July until the twenty fifth day of November  
as appears by said Certificate No 2872 hereunto  
annexed: to have and to hold said Certificate of  
Bounty Land to him the said Gabriel Jackson his  
heirs and assigns forever: And the said Thomas  
Morrow for himself his heirs & Executors, the said  
bargained Certificate with all the rights there-  
unto belonging to the said Gabriel Jackson his  
heirs and assigns shall and will warrant and  
forever defend against the Claims of all persons  
whomsoever — In testimony whereof he hath  
hereunto affixed his name & Seal in presence of  
Chas. W. Raymond & S. N. Hill, Witnesses of lawful age  
and me the said Chief Justice & Notary Public & Officer at the  
Town of Franklin this third day of July 1839.
