the County aforesaid,  
this day came and personally appeared,  
Mrs Mary, A. Faber, a resident citizen of  
said County, who being by me duly sworn,  
declares that she is a bona fide settler upon  
(160) One hundred and sixty acres, of vacant  
Public land, situated in said County, &  
surveyed for Joseph Elias Faber, on the last  
day of Oct. or the first of Sept. 1871, by L. H.  
Scrutcher, surveyor of said County; that she  
has occupied and improved the same, as  
a Homestead, for the period of three conse-  
-cutive years, beginning on the 15<sup>th</sup> day of  
August, 1871, that she is a married woman,  
+ that she is the wife of Joseph Elias Faber,  
+ that she makes this affidavit for the pur-  
-pose of obtaining a home title to the same for  
a Homestead, under Act. for the ben-  
-efit of actual occupants, of the Public lands,  
Approved May 26<sup>th</sup> 1873, + that she has not a  
homestead, other than the above.  
And also at the same time came and  
personally appeared, Henry Faber, and  
John Faber, two credible citizens of said County,  
to me well known, who being duly sworn,

depose and say that Mrs. Mary A. Fabor, the person first above named, in this affidavit, has actually settled upon and cultivated as a home stead, the land surveyed for her, on last day of Aug. or the first of Sept. 1841. by the surveyor aforesaid, for the period of three years, and they nor either of them, have any interest <sup>in the said</sup> land.
