 Mr. Tyler further says: In reference to the measure
 of Annexation: "May, I may go even farther, and
 declare before the initiative was taken, and when the
 preliminaries were nearly all arranged, their comple-
 tion being alone prevented by the death of Mr. Webster,
 and the appointment of an adjacent Commissioner to
 Mr. Van Zandt, by Texas." &c. From this it might
