Beginning 815 varas N 60 E and 50 Varas S 30 E from the S.W. corner of a Pile of Rock from which

Saml Bogarts house bears N 28 W and J W Shaws house N. 62 E

Thence N 30 W 1701 varas to R. A. Cester south corner

Thence N 60 E with R. A. Cester and P. Van Cordall South line; at 1705 varas intersecting the back line of Yarbroughs Cherinos League

Thence S 30 E at 1283 varas passing J. Cherinos South corner, at 1701 varas at the corner.

Thence S 60 W passing the North corner of J W Shaws Survey at 615 varas, crossing Childers creek at 13.60 varas passing the west corner of Sara J W Shaws survey at 1615 varas in all 1705
