acres of vacant public land, situated in said County, and
surveyed for Moses Looney on the 20th day of March
A. D. 1868 by Ward Keeler County Surveyor of said ^{County} that
they have occupied and improved the same as a Home
stead for the period of three consecutive years, beginning
on the Twentieth day of March 1868 that they constitute
a family and that they make this affidavit for the pur-
pose of obtaining a title to the same for a homestead
under an Act Supplementary to an Act to regulate
the Disposal of the public Lands of the State of Texas
Approved March 24th 1871 and that they have not
a homestead other than the above - And also
