acres of Vacant Public land, situated in said County, and  
surveyed for Moses Looney on the 20th day of March  
A.D. 1868 by Ward Keeler County Surveyor of said <sup>County</sup>, that  
they have occupied and improved the same as a home  
stead for the period of three consecutive years, beginning  
on the twentieth day of March 1868 that they constitute  
a family and that they make this affidavit for the pur  
pose of obtaining a title to the same for a homestead  
under an Act Supplementary to An act to regulate  
the disposal of the public lands of the State of Texas  
Approved March 24<sup>th</sup> 1871 and that they have not  
a homestead other than the above - And also
