

I also found plainly marked the S.W. line of
Leaborn Storms and by actual measurement
from the S.W. corner of Leaborn Storms run
ming 198^{ft} at a magnetic variation of
10^o 20' to the S.E. line of Samuel Shibley is 530
rods, and at the point where you strike
Shibley's line you are 210 rods (the 0^o from
Shibley S.W. corner. I find by making
this survey, (and I was very careful) a slight
conflict of Storms and Storms. I also find that
there is a vacancy of 70¹/₂ acres between
Leaborn Storms J. F. Ramsey and John Richardson.
I also find that Mr Ramsey's pre-emption, ac-
cording to the corrected field notes here
attached is actually correct on the ground
