in Bosque County Texas.

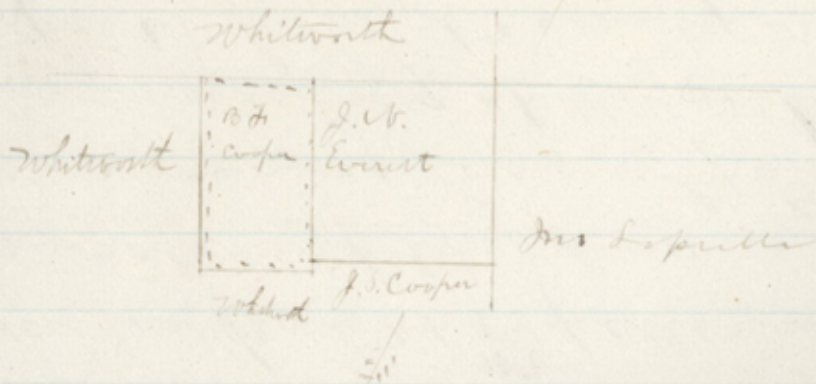
Beginning at the S.W. corner of

the foot of the mountain;

line 1000 rods to a pile of rocks;
being Whitworth's intermediate
corner; Thence N 60^o E with
Whitworth's line 580 rods to a
pile of rocks being Whitworth's
intermediate N.E. corner. Thence

AFFIDAVIT FOR PRE-EMPTION.

THE STATE OF TEXAS,

COUNTY OF BOSQUE.

Before me, *John A. Johnson*, Clerk of the *District* Court of Bosque County, this day personally appeared *B. F. Cooper*,

to me known, who after being by me duly sworn, upon his oath deposes and says: that he is now a bona fide settler upon *One Hundred and Sixty* acres of Land, that he believes to be of the public vacant lands of the State of Texas; that he is improving said land for a Homestead, and has no other; and further that he is a *Married* man

and makes this Affidavit for the purpose of obtaining a Home. Said Land is situated in Bosque County, about *6* miles *South* from Meridian, on the waters of *Bosque River* Creek: beginning *at the South West Corner of the Jasper N. Everett Survey* and more particularly described by the accompanying field notes.
