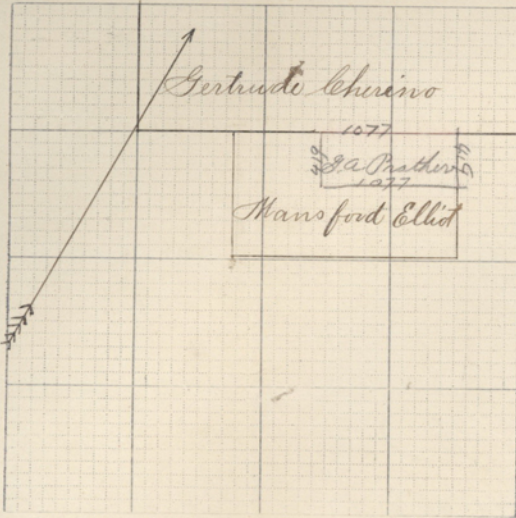

of ....., 1888, settled upon Eighty Acres of vacant pub-

lic lands in said Bosque County, which was surveyed for him on

the .... day of ....., 1888, by James N. Weeks, the County Sur-

vveyor of said County; that his said son, C. A. Prather, occupied and

improved the same as a homestead from the date aforementioned

till his death, which occurred on the 10th day of December, 1890;

that since the death of his son on said date, he, the affiant,

has continued to occupy and improve said land; that H. C. A. Pra-

ther aforesaid was a single man at the time he settled upon said

80 acres of land and remained single till his death; that said

land has been occupied and improved as a homestead for a period

of three consecutive years, including the time it was occupied

by the said C. A. Prather, now deceased, and by affiant, B. T. Pra-

ther, the father of said C. A. Prather, deceased; and that he, affiant,

is qualified to administer the will of the said C. A. Prather, deceased, for the purpose of obtaining a title to

the same as the joint heir with his wife, M. A. Prather, the
