That William Kennard having served faithfully and honorably for the term of Three Months from the First day of March 1836 until the Thirtieth day of May 1836 and having been honorably discharged is entitled to Three hundred twenty Acres Bounty Land, for which this is his CERTIFICATE.

And the said William Kennard is entitled to hold said Land, or to sell, alienate, convey and donate the same, and to exercise all rights of ownership over it.



Being the quantity of Land to which he is entitled by virtue of Land Warrant No. 2944 dated at Houston the 18th day of April 1838. issued to William E. Kennard and by him transferred to the said Henry Santhorpe.

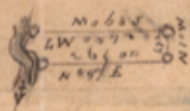

Kinard of the Republic and County aforesaid for and in consideration of the sum of One hundred dollars to me in hand paid by Henry Ganthorp of the said County and Republic the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, hath bargained sold and conveyed, and by these presents doth bargain sell and convey in real and perpetual Alienation unto the said Henry Ganthorp his heirs and assigns forever, all my right and title to three hundred and twenty acres of unlocated bounty land to me accruing from the Government of this Republic by virtue of my services in the Army as will appear by the Annexed Certificate Numbered 2944 and dated the 18th April 1838 which Certificate is hereby made a part of this deed.

Giving and granting unto the said Henry Ganthorp full and ample power and authority to select locate and perfect a proper and sufficient title or patent for the same in his own name, and for his own use and benefit
