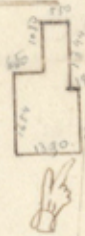

LETTERS OF CITIZENSHIP.

REPUBLIC OF TEXAS, COUNTY OF BRAZORIA.

By this public instrument **BE IT KNOWN**, That on this *Fifteenth* day of *March* — A. D. one thousand eight hundred and thirty-seven, *Edwin Harry* — a native of *the United States* born in the *the State of Pennsylvania* — aged *26* years, and now a resident of this republic, appeared at my office, and gave satisfactory evidence of being entitled to citizenship in conformity with the existing laws, and the said *Edwin Harry* — having taken the oath prescribed by the constitution, as will appear by the records of this court, I, the undersigned Chief Justice of the county court aforesaid, declare and certify that the said *Edwin Harry* — is entitled to all the rights and immunities appertaining or belonging to a citizen of this republic.
