You will please survey for me, and at my expense, under Chapter XI, page 29, Act of the First Called Session of the Twenty-sixth Legislature, approved February 23, 1900, the following described land, to-wit:

Situated in Houston County, Texas, about 2.3 miles SS0 W from the County site. Said tract is bounded as follows:

on the South by E Milon on the East by Charles Richards Ingram on the North by A W Marris on the West by Trinity River

I solemnly swear that I reside in Madison County, Texas; that my postoffice address is Madison Hill, Texas; that I desire said land surveyed with the intention of purchasing the same, and that I am not acting in collusion with, or attempting to acquire said land for any other person. 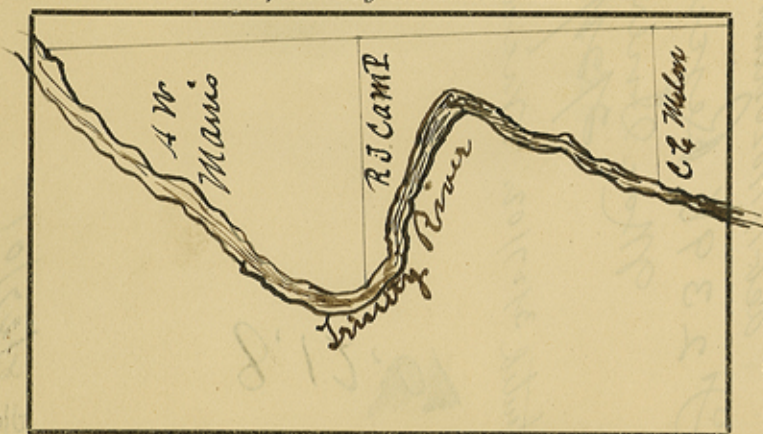

Before me D. A. Nunn Jr., a Notary Public in and for Houston County, Texas, on this day personally appeared B. M. Jones, county Surveyor of Houston County, Texas, who by me being duly sworn deposes and says that ~~some time during the month of June A. D. 1901, the exact day not now remembered,~~ *on the 29<sup>th</sup> day of May* he went upon the ground for the purpose of making survey for R. J. Camp, who had filed his application with him (now numbered S. F. 2383 in the General Land office) and did at that time make a partial survey of the said land, but did not meander the Trinity River, which is the West boundary line of said survey, for the reason that affiant was taken sick and could not at that time complete the work. That upon return to Crockett, his home, he endeavored by calculation to balance the field notes, taking for purpose of such calculation the meanders of said River as made by a former surveyor, but same would not balance, for the reason that the meanders were improperly given. That as soon as affiant recovered from his illness and on the 27th, day of July A. D. 1901, went upon the ground and ~~re~~-surveyed said land, made up ~~field~~ notes and plot and in due course of mail forwarded the same to Hon. Chas. Rogan, Commissioner of the General Land office at Austin, Texas. That thereafter on e Philip Robinson filed application with affiant on the 10<sup>th</sup> day of June A. D. 1901 and demanded field notes embracing the same land as surveyed for R. J. Camp that affiant did not go on the ground and make survey of the land for said Robinson but made up for him set of field notes of said land from the field notes as contained in his record book as made up for R. J. Camp. That when affiant surveyed said land said Robinson had no improvements of any kind *and was not in possession of said land* thereon, but R. J. Camp had thereon improvements in the way of fencing, wire etc. and was at work making improvements at the time said survey was made.
