

Dear Sir:

Replying to your favor of 9th inst., beg to advise that the application of Mr. Gilbert Ilseng seeking to but the land surveyed under the act of 1900 covered by the claim of Mrs. O.R. Anderson cannot be accepted for the reason that this claim was only approved subject to purchase of Mrs. O.R. Anderson within sixty days from the 9/10/1902 and Mrs. Anderson merely had the right to file her application to purchase the land and had no interest or title which she could transfer or convey. Under the act of 1900, section 6 provides that when an applicant fails to come in and apply for the land within the time prescribed by law that the same shall be placed upon the market subject to sale as sectionized school land law act of April 19, 1901, and you are, therefore, advised that the sixty days time allowed Mrs. Anderson to purchase this land expired on 10th inst. and we will place this land on the market subject to sale as above advised as soon as the claim can be reached.
