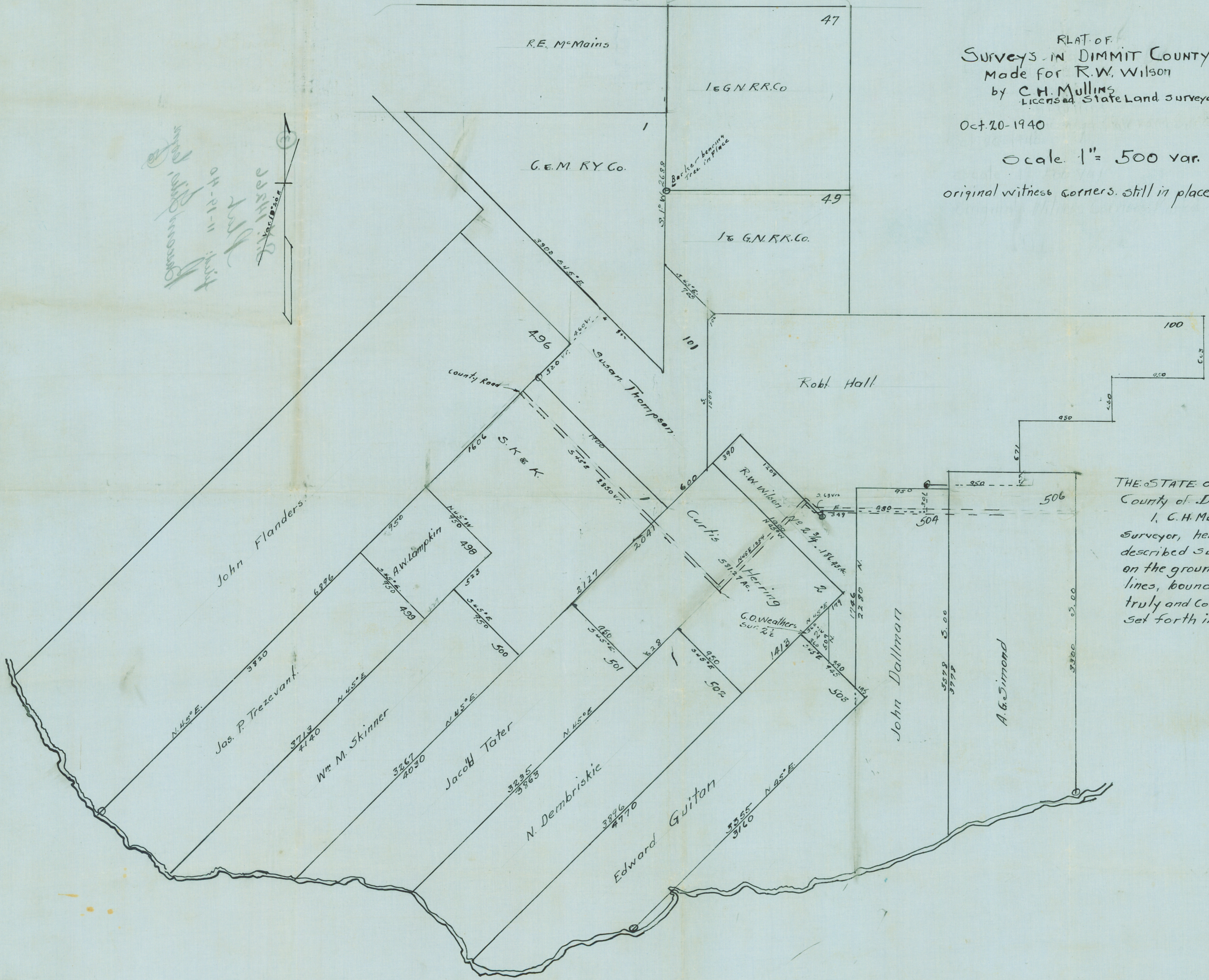

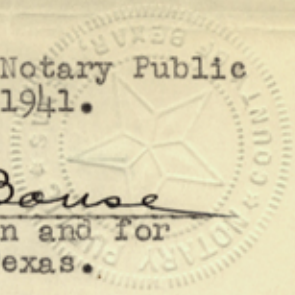

REPORT ON SURVEYS MADE FOR
R. W. WILSON IN DIMMIT COUNTY, TEXAS

I began at the S. E. corner of John Flanders survey No. 496 on Nueces River. This is a very old recognized corner of this survey. Has been a property division for the past seventy years. The bearing trees are gone at this time. I then ran North 45° East upon old fence line and gave the Jas. P. Trezevant Survey No. 499 its call distance of 382 varas, found a fence corner set for corner of A. W. Lampkin survey No. 498, at correct distance from river corner. Continuing north 45° E. with fence set stake at 4770 var. for most N. corner of Lampkin survey, and beginning cor. S. K. & K. No. 1. Continuing North 45° East with fence at 5234 vars. enter county road. Continuing N. 45° E. up center of road, at 6192 vars. road turns S. 45° E. Continuing N. 45° E. at 6376 var. pass N. E. cor. Sur. No. 1 - S. K. & K. and a Cor. of Susan Thompson No. 101 from which a dead pronged mesquite on prong marked with X bears S. 75° W. 7 var. from stake under fence. This cor. is 980 var. S. 45° W. from South line of survey No. 1 C. & M. R. R. Co. and 842 var. N. 45° W. from its most S. cor. as set by me on a previous survey.

I then came back to center of County Road where it turns S. 45° E. and ran down road. At 2850 var. road turns N. 45° E. at 1254 var. road turn S. 45° E. at 106 var. road turns East at 63 var. on East course pass 63 var. North of a cor. of Robt. Hall survey No. 100 a pile of stone with iron pipe from which a pronged mesquite bears N. 22° E. 35 var. Continuing down center of Road East at 950 var. Ran North 301 var. and found large forked mesquite N. 13° E. 26 var. Back to rock pile and iron pipe cor. Robt. Hall. I ran South 45° E. 692 vars. and set a stake, from this stake I ran S. 45° W. to river. Chained back from river N. 45° E. at 4770 var. set cor. for Edward Guitan No. 503 and cor. of C. O. Weathers on East line of Curtis Herring. Continuing No. 45° E. at 360 var. set N. cor. of Weathers, at 929 vars. reach corner set on run fence cor. of Robt. Hall.

Back at cor. of Guitan and C. O. Weathers, I ran S. 45° E. at 945 vars. found a very old stake in an open right-of-way running S. 45° W. for line of John Dallman. I then ran S. 45° W. down Right-of-way at 2557 var. rounded a loop in river, crossed same twice and continued S. 45° W. a total distance of 3355 var. from which an Elm, half dead, 20" in diameter. marked with 3 hacks on S side standing on edge of river bank. There are many big mesquites here but river has gotten the one that was marked. From this bearing tree, I then set the interior cor. of John Dallman 3160 var. N. 45° E. This cor. is 195 var. S. 45° W. from N. E. corner of Survey No. 503 Guitan making a small conflict here.

Back at turn in county road S. 45° E. 2850 var. from Flanders line, I ran S. 45° W. to river. Here I found a very large (30") ash still standing but badly decayed and fire marked on bank of river. I then measured N. 45° E. up line between sur. Nos. 501 and 502 at 3863 var. set stake for cor. of sur. 502. Then ran S. 45° E. 950 to a point on line between survey Nos. 502 and 503, which point is 3896 var. from river. Back to N. W. cor. Dembriskie No. 502 continued N. 45° E. at 449 var. from cor. of sur. 502 reach center of County road, at point where same turn N. 45° E. 2850 S. 45° E. from Flanders line.

Then I went back to a point in County Road S. 45° E. 1900 var. from Flander line and ran S. 45° W. to river. At river I find no tract of any bearing tree. I then chained back North 45° E. at 4030 var. set N. W. cor. of survey No. 501, Jacob Tater.

Continuing N. 45° E. crossing County Road to 6071 vars. set most North cor. of Curtis Herring No. 2.

Back to N. W. cor. Survey No. 501, I ran S. 45° E. 950 var. and hit the line surveys No. 501 and 502 at a point 3235 var. N. 45° E. from river.

Then back at N. W. cor. Jas P. Trezevant on line of John Flander, I ran S. 45° E. 950 var. with fence, set corner A. W. Lampkin on line of survey No. 500 Wm. M. Skinner.
Thence S. 45° W. at 3713 var. bank of river.

Back at N. E. cor. survey No. 499, I ran N. 45° E. 427 var. set N. W. cor. of Wm. M. Skinner survey No. 500 4030 var. from bank of river. From this placement on the ground of the river surveys, I placed Survey No. 1 S. K. & K. and No. 2 Curtis Herring.

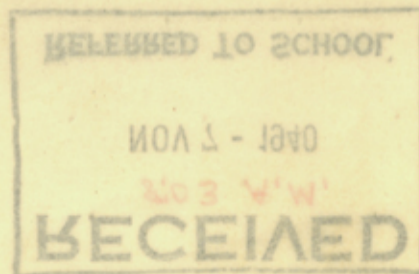
Bearing tree fro the Susan Thompson on East line of John Flander fits for North cor. of sur. No. 1

I ran from rock mound and iron pipe cor. 63 var. south of road set for a cor. of Robert Hall, N. 45° W. 1209 var. and intersected N. W. Line of Curtis Herring prolonged - 390 var. from corner.

From this construction, I placed R. W. Wilson survey No. 2-3/4 as shown by Plat submitted here.

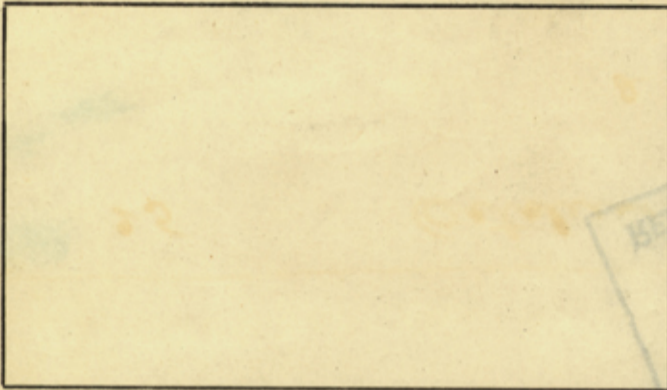

Explanation of a survey made for R.W.Wilson to make plain the reason for a resurvey and corrected field notes for S.F.No.14266 known as R.W.Wilson Sur.No.2 3/4, Vol.5-Pg.391.The attached plat,a Dimmit County Sketch is made a part of this report.

The said lands are situated in Dimmit County about 27 miles N 77 E. from Carrizo Springs,the county site.

Having obtained a working sketch,made by the General Land Office, Austin Texas,Jan.19,1935 showing area to the west and north also Plat made bysurveor Delany W.Cobb July 1,1929 showing survey No.2 1/2 C.O. Weathers,also a plat made by J.G.McDonald June 19th.1851 showing his survey of adjoining survey on the north side of Nueces River.Also certified coppies of various field notes of surveys in this area,all of record in the General Land Office.I decided that the intire group of river surveys were laid out by Mr.J.G.McDonald in 1851 as shown by his map and that the various river surveys showns to have been surveyed by Jacob Huechler in 1874 and R.J.Carr in 1882 are the same survey and same description as were originally survey^dby Mr.Mc Donald, and numbered.

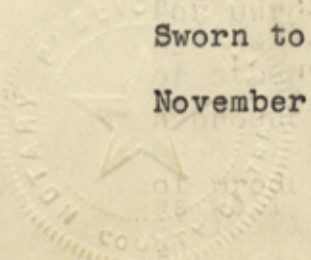

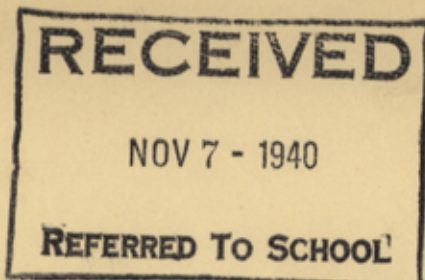

Mr. R. W. Wilson and Mr. C. H. Mullins, Licensed State Land Surveyor, have discussed with me, and Mr. Mullins has submitted to me his survey of the Wilson land as made by him in July of this year and which is a blue print of what Mr. Mullins advises is from the original which has been delivered to your office.

Mr. Mullins advises me that the upper river corner of the J. P. Trezevant Survey No. 499 is definitely established on the ground and that the lower river corner of the Edward Guitan Survey No. 503 is likewise definitely established on the ground, but that none of the intervening corners of the other surveys can be located on the ground. In starting with the upper known corner and platting in successively the J. P. Trezevant, William Skinner, Jacob Tater, N. Dembriski and Edward Guitan, makes a considerable shortage of acreage in each instance except the latter because of the fact that the third call in each survey which calls to go to the river is short on the ground. The resulting effect of this procedure on the Curtis Herring Survey No. 2 is to cut the Southeast half considerably short in acreage and stop the Northeast line of this survey a considerable distance from the place where it calls to go and has always been recognized to go. In other words, the Curtis Herring has always been recognized as joining up with the Robert Hall Survey No. 100 and the Robert Hall Survey field notes call for the Curtis Herring No. 2, yet under the method of laying out these surveys on Mr. Mullins' map it is indicated a strip of land 390 varas wide and totaling in all nearly 200 acres between the Herring, Hall and Dallman.
